Welcome to Talents and Short Film Market vol. 7.

As you might have noticed, TSFM changed its name after six successful editions. Torino became Talents.

There are several reasons behind this choice. First of all, since our pandemic edition in 2020 TSFM has been constantly expanding its outreach. In the last two years we have been offering new activities, in various locations other than Torino, both in Italy - Alto-Adige/Südtirol, Sardegna, Trentino and Valle d'Aosta - and beyond national borders - in Belgium, Cyprus, Greece, North Macedonia, Spain and Sweden. Additionally, even more than in the past, TSFM aims to facilitate the access to markets of new talented film professionals. This goal is reached by organising developing programmes and providing a platform where newcomers can promote their projects, increase their expertise, maximise their networking opportunities and access our classical B2B market activities.

Nonetheless, Torino remains at the centre of our expanded universe that we have been venturing in the last two years, hosting for the seventh time in a row our main event of the year: our on-site market, or, as we call it, the volume 7 edition. TSFM is almost entirely back to II Circolo dei Lettori, our renowned location since 2018. Other activities take place at Museo del Cinema - for an Extended Reality showcase - and at Cinema Romano - for two short film screenings and a masterclass, made in collaboration with Torino Film Festival.

Our programme spans through several pitching sessions dedicated to new short films projects and, for the first time ever, to work-in-progress shorts. Once more it features a pitch for representatives of festivals programming shorts. In addition, following the launch of A Long Way Home - a new workshop for kickstarting upcoming feature film projects based on or inspired by a previously released short film - the developed projects will be pitched during volume 7 and one will be selected by TorinoFilmLab for script developing in 2023.

The programme also features several panels on different topics - from production design, to film education, from short film criticism to the relationship between animation and XR, from the role of shorts in powering underrepresented communities to the state of short film acquisitions and the role of festivals - and a keynote presentation followed by a discussion on fair work in the festival circuit.

The Country In Focus of 2022 is Germany. Made in collaboration with AG Kurzfilm – German Short Film Association, it features a keynote followed by a panel discussion, a dedicated market screening and a public screening plus a masterclass by director Sylvia Schedelbauer.

The networking opportunities have been increased, with even more room for attending professionals where to implement their B2B strategies, and new dedicated one-on-one sessions for acquisition and sales professionals labelled Distributors Meet Buyers.

Finally, alongside our online Video-Library, TSFM proposes again a series of market screenings inside II Circolo dei Lettori for the first time since 2019.

We wish you all a very productive TSFM vol. 7!

Not so long ago, television was the dominant media for showcasing short films to a more general audience, mostly unaware of the genre. The number of short film buyers actively attending B2B events and markets have noticeably lowered while the number of sales or distributors seems to have increased, thus creating a short circuit in the demand and supply chain. Film schools and universities teaching filmmaking play an important role in the training of new professionals. Short films are undoubtedly the format alumni are required to develop in order to advance through their academic careers. An article published in 2004 titled The Short Film and Critics: Do They Ever Meet? written by Laurence Boyce for FIPRESCI reports the outcomes of a workshop on Short Film and Criticism held at the 50th Internationale Kurzfilmtage Oberhausen. Its reading is a useful insight in order to retrospectively understand the relationship between film criticism and the short form of cinema as it was almost 20 years ago. In the meantime, however, much has changed: paper outlets have lost prominence, while online publications have flourished. Starting from a historical point of view, the panel aims to investigate the impact and influence film criticism has on the short film industry today and vice versa.

How much is Enough? Fair work in the (short) film festival circuit: a call for action

The issue of fair work spans many industries and it is quite prominent in the cultural sector. The film festival circuit makes no exception. However, an open discussion concerning fair payment of festival workers has been mostly avoided by the industry. One of the reasons is the different labour laws and regulations in place in each country.

This keynote aims to open this long due discussion about fair work in the film festival circuit, especially in the short film one.

The session will start with a presentation by the Forum Õsterreichischer Filmfestivals (FÖFF) on the status quo of fair pay in Austria. Recently the Forum published fair pay guidelines for its members, following an internal survey of the different levels of payment in different festivals for various festival jobs - from leadership to interns. At the same time Austrian funding institutions have started taking on some responsibility for fair wages for cultural work. Yet the situation of precarious festival work in Austria is still far from being resolved, as inflation is starting to destroy the limited gains and many institutions are still heavily underfunded. Against this background the presentation will give insights in the work-in-progress and controversial questions of reaching a binding fair wage policy among festivals with highly different ressources and diverse makeups.

The second part will consist of a moderated discussion between the keynote speaker and three respondents, in order to further discuss the topic and how to effectively reapply the good practice implemented by FÖFF on a transnational scale.

It is said that festivals are the exploitation and presentation platform par excellence for short films. But what exactly are festivals? What specifically do they do and what has changed as a result of the pandemic? Has our view perhaps been sharpened in times when gatherings in front of screens were impossible?

Katrin Mundt's keynote gives an overview of the extraordinarily diverse short film festival landscape in Germany. It discusses the different contexts in which short film is presented, and the changing ways in which it finds its audiences. It asks how the work for and collaboration between festivals has been impacted, and in what kind of geography festivals are likely to operate in the future. And finally, how can the structures of financing, organisation and communication be rethought to make festival work more sustainable?

The panelists, representing different forms of festivals, contribute to the discussion based on their experiences and invite the audience to join in the discussion about the future and potential of short film festivals.

AG Kurzfilm – German Short Film Association has invited the German-Japanese artist Sylvia Schedelbauer to curate a short film program that she will present in person as part of her masterclass. The event will be an opportunity to discuss her filmic approach, her artistic development, and the influences that have shaped her as an artist. Schedelbauer will frame the curated films with her very first and most recent works: MEMORIES (2004) and OH, BUTTERFLY (2022); two films that use very different formal styles to address similar questions around family myth and secrets. The films that Schedelbauer selected include SEEDS (Philippa Ndisi-Herrmann, KE 2016), THE LAST MANGO BEFORE THE MONSOON (Payal Kapadia, IN 2014) and KICKING THE CLOUDS (Sky Hopinka, USA 2021). All films share an experimental and poetic approach in working with image, sound, music, and storytelling while relating to themes such as history, memory, family, and questions of belonging, place, identity, and dislocation.

Sylvia Schedelbauer's Bio

Born in Tokyo, Sylvia Schedelbauer moved to Berlin in 1993, where she has been based since. She studied at the University of Arts Berlin. Her films negotiate the space between broader historical narratives and personal, psychological realms mainly through poetic manipulations of found and archival footage.

The TSFM Video-Library offers a selection of short films released in 2021 and 2022 and will be available online from November 27th 2022 until May 31st 2023.

TSFM Video-Library aims to present short films that might meet the different expectations of the various participants attending the event – from buyers to distributors, from festival programmers to producers or commissioning editors scouting for new talents. The Library is characterised by the intense scouting and curation work that members of the TSFM team devote to it throughout the year.

The Video-Library features a series of Curated Programmes (CP) presenting recently released short films together with titles that are still World Premieres. Each programme lasts for around one hour and thirty minutes, presenting five to six short films. Additionally, a series of Guest Programmes (GP) are also available to watch. They have been created in collaboration with and curated by TSFM's partners such as film institutes, film funds, institutions, film schools and distributors, with the aim to present their most up-to-date catalogues or, in some cases, retrospectives.

Since 2019, the Video-Library is accessible exclusively in a digital form, so that users can easily access it via their own computers, tablets or even smartphones without the need to book or wait for an available computer on-site during the market days.

The Video-Library is equipped with an in-house search engine that viewers can easily use in order to browse all the films on the platform. Access to the Video-Library is reserved to TSFM vol. 7 accredited guests only.



A Long Home

How It Works

A Long Way Home is an international co-production pitch for upcoming feature film projects based on or inspired by a previously released short film. Selected participants will have ten minutes to pitch their project to an audience of film professionals. Following the pitch session, participants will attend a series of one-on-one meetings with industry professionals scheduled by the TSFM team.

The pitch is the final leg of A Long Way Home, an online workshop for kickstarting upcoming feature film projects based on or inspired by a previously released short film. The workshop is divided into two strands: A Long Way Home for Filmmakers and A Long Way Home for Creative Producers. In order to start the transition of their completed short film into a feature film project, five selected participants for A Long Way Home for Filmmakers attend an online developing workshop under the guidance of a tutor and supported by a creative producer participating in A Long Way Home for Creative Producers, to whom they have been matched during the selection process.

Awards

TFL Award. Team members of TorinoFilmLab will select one project that will be invited to participate in a TFL Next - Feature Film workshop in 2023.

Experience Sardegna Award. Members of Sardegna Film Commission (SFC) will select one project as the recipient of the Experience Sardegna Award worth € 5000. The award consists of an exploratory trip of the island for three members of the project team, who will be accompanied by a local location manager. The costs are fully covered by the SFC. An excellent opportunity to discover one of the most fascinating, mysterious and film friendly lands of Europe.



Animation Extended Lab

How It Works

Animation Extended Lab is a development programme designed for audiovisual projects of animation, including short films, TV series/specials, extended reality experiences and games. Selected participants will have five minutes to pitch their project to an audience of film professionals. Following the pitch session, participants will attend a series of one-on-one meetings with industry professionals scheduled by the TSFM team.

The workshop is aimed at intercepting young Italian talents, recently graduate, and European talents, and is equally open to authors, director and producers presenting a concept for an audiovisual project in animation and to bring it into development following specific goals, tailor-made on each project necessities. After the Année Zéro in 2021, presenting a case history of success, and thanks to the support of FilmCentrum Sweden and the national film school CSC - Animation Division of Turin, the first edition of Animation Extended Lab has selected five authors & directors whom will be pitching: four short films, two 2D animated and two stop-motion & mixed media, and one TV series. Guests mentors for the first editions, lecturing participants about production, market and distribution for animation are Siniša Juričić (Nukleus Film, Levante Productions); Aneta Ozorek (Kaboom Animation Festival); Luce Grosjean (Miyu Distribution).






